What do I do with?

Some items such as medical wastes, fluorescent bulbs and tubes, needles, fuel tanks, electronics and chemicals require special handling and are not allowed in garbage.



Motor Oil

Households may dispose of up to five gallons of motor oil at any of the Skagit County Recycling Sites. Visit **skagitcounty.net** for more information.

Electronics

Recycle electronics, computers, monitors and TVs, Visit http://www.ecyclewashington.org for free recycling drop-off locations.

Large Appliances

Large Appliances (refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, clothes washers, dryers, stoves, ranges, furnaces, etc.) Bring items to a transfer station. Visit https://www.skagitcounty.net and search "solid waste" for accepted materials.
